## BAPTISMS AT SUNDAY MASS THIS EASTERTIDE

We think of the celebration of Easter each year as an commemoration of the Lord's resurrection, and maybe for the whole of the 50-day season of Easter a commemoration of his being present in the Christian community after his resurrection, teaching them up to his Ascension, and then a final eight days before the Holy Spirit came on the apostles at Pentecost, the fiftieth day. But Easter Sunday, and the fifty-day season, are more than that.

Easter is traditionally an important time of the year for administering baptism, either during Easter night or during the fifty-day season, because in the sacrament we share in the Lord's resurrection. St Paul wrote the following to the Romans: 'You have been taught that when we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life' (6:3-4).

During Easter, those of us who are already baptised also commemorate our sharing in the Lord's new, risen life, which began with our baptism. The prayers of the Mass and the Divine Office during the season of Easter often make reference to that commemoration.

This year in our diocese, families presenting infants for baptism are encouraged to schedule the baptism during a Sunday Mass in the fifty-day season of Easter. Practically speaking, this adds just five minutes to a Mass as some elements of the baptismal liturgy are either done before Mass or are replaced by parts of the Mass itself (e.g. the readings).

Our baptism booking system in the family of parishes will facilitate baptisms at Sunday Mass for the season of Easter this year. Please consider the invitation to schedule during Sunday Mass. Please encourage your relatives to have the baptism at Mass where the whole parish community has an opportunity to

witness a baptism and recall for ourselves the very tight connection between baptism and the Lord's resurrection.

### **Barryroe Parishioners**

are invited to join the Income Tax Relief to Charities Scheme. The scheme works on the basis that parishioners/donors have their contributions to the parish recorded (using the envelope system, Payzone, or a standing order, etc.), and the recorded figure is used to make an application to the state once per year. Some of the income tax they've already paid is then diverted to the parish and is in proportion to the donation given to the parish in the corresponding year. A donation of €250 in the period of a year would yield over €100 income tax given to the parish, provided sufficient income tax had been paid. The scheme is highly confidential, both at parish level where only the resident priest has access to records of donations and participants in the scheme; the state is also highly respectful of people's privacy and discloses nothing to the parish about individual donors, who has actually paid income tax or sufficient tax for the scheme and their donations, etc. Participation in the scheme must be renewed frequently and most people who

first joined it in Barryroe at the time of the church renovations are now no longer part of it but may not realise it. For both 2023 and 2024, the parish received approximately €10,000, i.e. a total of €20,000. That is a sizeable amount of money for a parish whose typical income is about €90,000 per annum. Those payments were both processed last year and will appear in the accounts presently. Please do consider joining the scheme, or renewing your participation. Approach Fr Fergus for a printed mandate to complete and return to him.
